SUBJECT:

CLASSIFICATION OF fat liquoring agent for the leather industry.

The classification of fat liquoring agents for the industry, has been under discussion for quite a time. On a reference having been made, the Customs Co-operation Council, has advised that the products under reference used for fat liquoring leather essentially consist of the following two categories of constituents:-

- (1) A raw oil (all types of enamel oils, some mineral oils and some vegeable oils) which can suitably be incorporated into the leather; and
- (2) A soap or sulphated oil (or possibly other kind of emulsifying agent) which serves as a carrier of the above raw oil.

In the opinion of the Customs Co-operation Council, products of this kind are classified in heading 34.03 preparations of a kind use for oil or grease treatment leather (see explanatory Note 34.03, page 505), provided they do not contain 70% or more by weight of petroleum oils or life obtained from bituminous minerals.

Keeping in view the above criteria of classification of fat liquors. The following products since consist principally of suphited or sulphiled oil (which acts as emulsifying agent) and neutral oil (such as fish oil, marine animal oil) are properly classifiable in heading 34.03:

- (1) Sulphirol St
- (2) Sulphirol S.60
- (3) Sulphirol CR.60
- (4) Sulphriol EG 60
- (5) Sulphirol A
- (6) Synthol A
- (7) Leather oil M.N.
- (8) Leather oil P.R.
- (9) Leather oil M.T.
- (10)Leather oil Q.R.
