DETERMINATION OF CUSTOM VALUES OF GLYCERIN UNDER SECTION 25-A OF THE CUSTOMS ACT, 1969

(VALUATION RULING NO. 1540/2021)

In exercise of the powers conferred under Section 25-A of the Customs Act, 1969, Customs values of Glycerin are determined as follows:

2. Background of the valuation issue: Earlier the customs values of Chemicals, Glycerin, Chlorinated Paraffin Wax (Liquid) And Calcium Carbide were determined under Section 25A of the Customs Act, 1969 vide Valuation Ruing No.1468/2020 dated 08-09-2020. Representations were received from the importers as well as Pakistan Soap Manufacturers Association for redetermination of values in accordance with the prevailing prices in the international market and also to attach further item in the Ruling with accredited international publications. Keeping in new above, this Directorate General initiated an exercise for re-determination of the Customs values of subject items.

3. Stakeholders' participation in determination of Customs values: Meeting with stakeholders was held on 30-06-2021 to discuss the issue of valuation of subject goods. The stakeholders were requested to furnish following documents before or during the course of stakeholders' meetings:

- i. Invoices of imports during last three months showing factual value.
- Websites, names and E-mail addresses of known foreign manufacturers of the item in question through which the actual current value can be ascertained.
- Copies of Contracts made / LCs opened during the last three months showing the value of item in question.
- Copies of Sales Tax Invoices issued during last four months showing the difference in price (excluding duty and taxes) to substantiate their contentions.
- 4. During the meeting, the importers/stakeholders apprised that the prices of Glycerin are published in ICIS and there is no need to fix the value. There was a general consensus among the participants that the value of Glycerin should be hedged with the accredited publication of ICIS as done in a number of other valuation rulings.

- 5. Method adopted to determine Customs values: Valuation methods provided in Section 25 of the Customs Act, 1969, were duly applied in their regular sequential order to arrive at customs values of subject goods. The transaction value method as provided in Sub-Section (1) of Section 25 of the Customs Act, 1969, was found inapplicable because requisite information was not available as per law. The wide variation of values displayed in the import data as available on record also strengthened the aforementioned fact. Hence requisite information under law was not available to arrive at the transaction value. Therefore, identical / similar goods value methods as provided in Sub-Sections (5) & (6) of Section 25 ibid were examined for applicability to the valuation issue in the instant case. The same provided some reference values but could not be exclusively and solely relied upon. In line with the statutory sequential order of Section 25, this office conducted market inquiries under sub-Section (7) of section 25 of the Customs Act, 1969, however, this method of valuation could not be exclusively relied upon. Therefore, valuation method vide Section 25(8) was examined for valuation but the same also could not be applied as conversion cost from the constituent material and allied expenses, at the country of export were not available for manufacturing of the subject goods. Finally, clearance data, market information and international prices through internet were examined thoroughly and the information so gathered were utilized and analyzed for determination of customs values of the subject goods under Section 25 (9) of the Customs Act, 1969.
- 6. Customs values for Glycerin hereinafter specified shall be assessed to duty / taxes on the following minimum Customs values given against them in the Table below: -

Note: The above given prices are for Drums Packing, in case the subject goods are imported in bulk (ISO Tanks / Flexi Tanks / Flexi Bags), US\$75/MT shall be subtracted for the assessment purposes.

- 7. In cases where declared/ transaction values are higher than the Customs values determined in this Ruling, the assessing officers shall apply those values in terms of Sub-Section (1) of Section 25 of the Customs Act, 1969. In case of consignments imported by air, the assessing officer shall take into account the differential between air freight and sea freight while applying the Customs values in this Ruling.
- 8. Validity of this Valuation Ruling: The values determined vide this Ruling shall be the applicable Customs value for assessment of subject imported goods until and unless it is rescinded or revised by the competent authority in terms of Sub-Section (4) of Section 25-A of the Customs Act, 1969.
- Revision of the value determined vide this Valuation Ruling: A revision petition may be filed against this Ruling, as provided under Section 25-D of the Customs Act, 1969, within 30

days from the date of issue of this ruling, before the Director General, Directorate General of Customs Valuation, 7th Floor, Custom House, Karachi.

- 10. The Collectors of Customs may kindly ensure that the values given in this Valuation Ruling for the given description of goods are applied by the concerned staff without fail. Any anomaly observed may kindly be brought to the notice of this Directorate General immediately. Customs values determined in the ruling are for the descriptions and specifications as mentioned in this Valuation Ruling. HS Codes are mentioned for illustrative purposes so that Valuation Ruling values are made accessible to the assessing officers. The assessment shall be finalized on the basis of correct classification after fulfilling requisite formalities related to importability or any other certifications required thereon. In addition to this, it is necessary to verify that there is no mis-declaration of any sort or violation of Import Policy Order or Section 15 of the Customs Act, 1969 or any other law in vogue therein.
- 11. This Valuation Ruling supersedes Sr. No. 1 of the Valuation Ruling No. 1468/2020 dated 08-09-2020.
